Objectives and investment policy

The Fund seeks to achieve income and growth primarily through investment in debt securities of governments, government agencies, supranationals and corporates, who are based in the emerging markets of Latin America, Asia and Europe. The Fund may also invest in money-market securities and mortgage-backed and asset-backed securities.

The investment manager actively selects, purchases and sells securities with the aim of meeting the investment objectives of the Fund.

The Fund may use derivatives with the aim of managing interest rate and currency risk more efficiently, and for both hedging and investment purposes. These may include synthetic short positions where the Fund seeks to benefit from the sale of an asset, asset class or currency that it does not physically own.

Recommendation: this Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 12 months.

Your shares are accumulating, meaning that income and gains of the Fund will be reinvested to increase the value of the Fund.

Shares can normally be bought and sold on any business day, being a day on which banks are open for business in Ireland, the UK and the US.

The impact of portfolio transaction charges is likely to be material due to the strategy adopted by the Fund. Such costs are paid from the assets of the Fund in addition to the ongoing charges set out below.

Your shares are denominated in Swiss Francs. Typically, hard currency assets held by the Fund will be hedged to Swiss Francs, whilst local currency emerging market assets will typically be unhedged.

The Fund is actively managed with reference to the 70% J. P. Morgan EMBI Global Diversified Bond Index (currency hedged to the Swiss Franc) / 30% JPM GBI-EM Global Diversified (Unhedged) (the “Index”). The Index is used (i) as a universe from which to select or hold securities; and (ii) to measure performance of the Fund. The investment manager has discretion over the composition of the portfolio of the Fund and may select securities not included in the Index. However, in normal market circumstances, whilst it is expected that a significant portion of the Fund’s constituents will also be Index constituents, deviations from the Index may be material. Whilst the investment manager does not employ a defined strategy to align with a benchmark during periods of volatility, it will take account of the market environment and perceived risks at any given time and will employ its investment discretion as described in the investment policy accordingly.

Risk and reward profile



The risk indicator was calculated using historic fund returns and may not be a reliable indicator of the risk profile of the Fund.

The risk category shown is not guaranteed and may change over time. The lowest category does not mean your investment is ‘risk free’.

The Fund is rated 5 because of the medium level of risk due to the nature of its investments in debt instruments. The following risk factors may give rise to performance volatility and may expose the Fund to losses: (i) the value of the Fund will rise as bond yields generally fall but will fall in the event that bond yields generally rise; (ii) changes in the perceived credit worthiness of bond issuers will contribute to performance volatility. A fall in credit worthiness will generally lead to a fall in the value of the Fund and vice versa; and (iii) currency movements may give rise to changes in the value of the share class, especially as emerging market currencies move up and down versus the Swiss Franc.

The risk indicator is measured on a share class basis. Where share classes of the Fund have temporarily differing risk indicators, the representative share class will show the higher risk category.

Material risks not adequately captured by the risk indicator include:

Counterparty risk: The insolvency of any institutions providing services such as custody or acting as counterparty to any transaction may expose the Fund to financial loss, including counterparties to derivatives and foreign exchange trades.

Credit risk: An issuer may fail to repay income or capital in full, leading to a financial loss for the Fund.

Liquidity risk: There may be some circumstances in which the ability to sell certain assets at little cost will be impaired.

Derivative Risk: Gains and losses from the use of derivatives may be greater than where the underlying investment is purchased directly by the Fund.

Operational Risk: There may be risks associated with the safekeeping of the assets by the Depositary and sub-custodians.

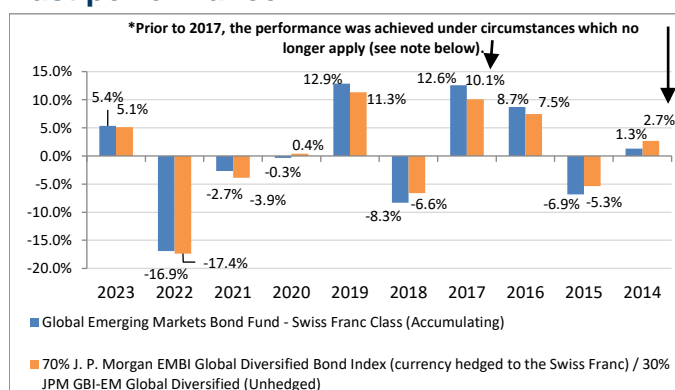
The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

Past performance

The chart shows the Fund's annual performance in Swiss Francs for each calendar year over the period displayed. The performance of the share class is not tracking the index in the chart.

The Fund was approved by the Central Bank of Ireland in 2002 and this share class launched in 2011.

*Please note that from end June 2017, the share class hedging approach changed to hedge back to Swiss Francs only the portion of the Fund that is held in hard currency assets. Local currency assets are largely held unhedged versus the Swiss Franc. Accordingly, the 30% benchmark component was also changed on that date from the JPM GBI-EM Global Diversified (unhedged in US Dollars, but hedged back from USD to Swiss Francs) to the current JPM GBI-EM Global Diversified, unhedged in Swiss Franc terms).
